Listening Ear has 17 incredible child foster care parents and four foster care workers serving over 30 foster youth each year through mid and northern Michigan.

Sharon states, "Often times, we hear from doctors and teachers who have known the child for years take notice of how the child is improving in their new foster care home. I feel a sense of accomplishment and am recharged every time I see a child's success." Sharon who has worked for Listening Ear since 2005, said, "It's very inspiring to me to see how our foster parents advocate for the youth placed in their care with such ferocity in order to get the best services. offered. I'm so proud to work with such great foster care parents."

Sharon sees progress with the children she works with, but also the changes by some of the children's biological parents. "It's just as rewarding to see the child's biological family begin. to make repairs in their lives once the burdens of such intense challenging behaviors have been alleviated by voluntarily placing their child into our foster care program. I am so proud of the children, foster care parents and the biological parents working together to meet the child's needs."

A Promise Made... Meet Sara



Sara says "I get to see their amazing resilience..."

"About 15 years ago, after going through some very difficult times and struggling to find strength and faith, I made a promise to myself and God. If I could make it through this difficult moment, I promise to focus my life on helping others who were going through difficulties," said Sara Sroufe, a therapist for the Child Sexual Abuse Program.

Sara also credits her patient parents for her commitment to helping others. "Some people ask me how it is that I could work in a program for children who are victims of sexual abuse - it is so sad after all. But I feel that I am very fortunate to be able to join with children and their caregivers because I get to witness their healing, and often I get to see them as they shift from being victims to seeing themselves as survivors. I get to see their amazing resilience and see their transformation into confident young adults and that is why I do what I do," Sara said. An employee of Listening Ear for over a decade, Sara has recently become a certified trauma focused CBT therapist. "Sexually abused children are fortunate to have such a skilled and committed therapist," according to Donald Schuster, Director of Listening Ear.

A Natural Healer ... Meet Erin

"I have been helping others since childhood," stated Erin Rubingh, a case manager for the Transitional Living Program that focuses on supporting homeless youth. "In middle school I volunteered weekly at the Red Cross Food Pantry and was voted a "natural helper." I was lucky to have loving parents who believed in serving others."

Erin said, "Young people need someone they can speak with who will listen. The young people I see are often abused, neglected, distrustful and lack parental support." Erin has worked with homeless youth for over five years at Listening Ear. She states, "When you start listening and supporting the youth, you find they blossom and succeed." One of the first youth she helped years ago still stays in contact with her. The young man was homeless, had no parents in his life and was bouncing from place to place. "He was very motivated and it was an honor supporting him. With Listening Ear's support, he finished high school, attended college and today is a Police Officer. We spoke recently and he is now married with two children and a home of his own." Erin is a "natural helper" that takes great pride in helping homeless youth succeed in life.
